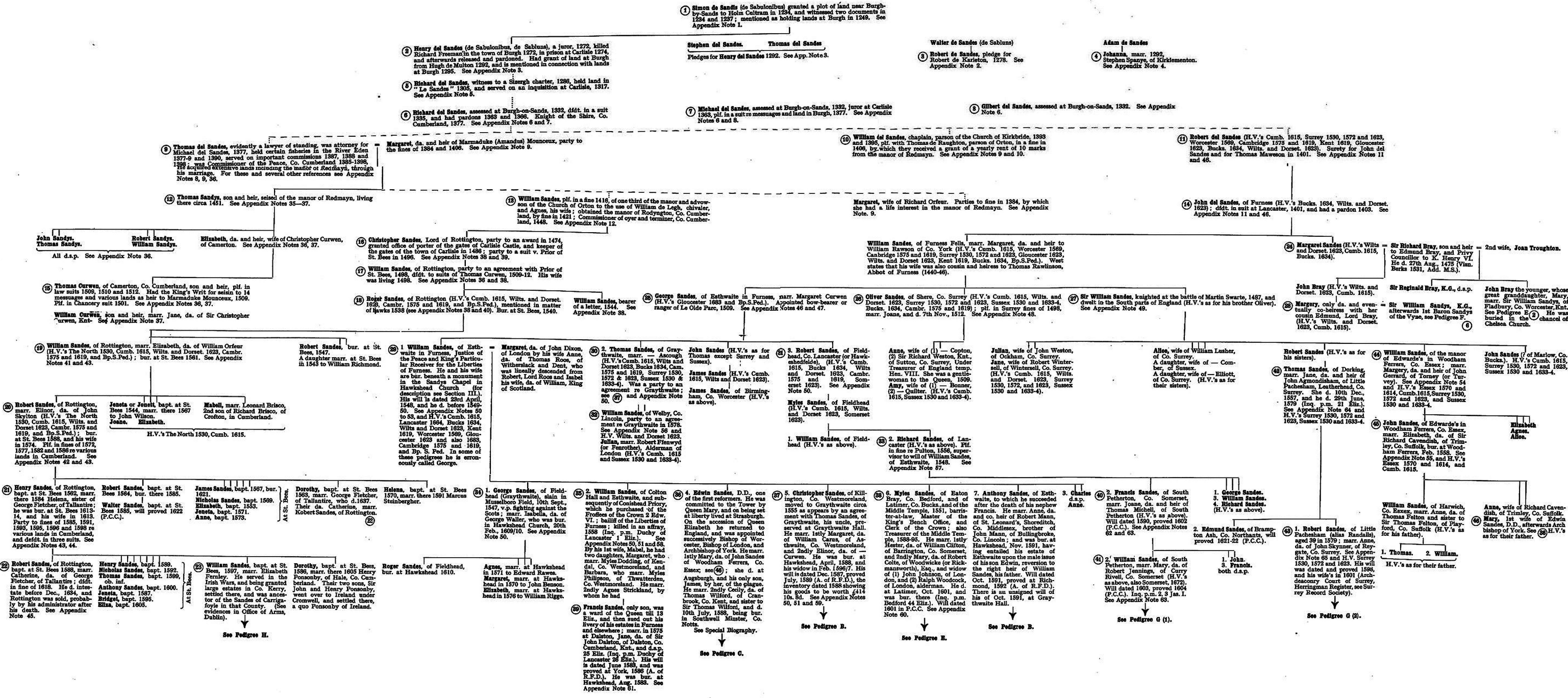

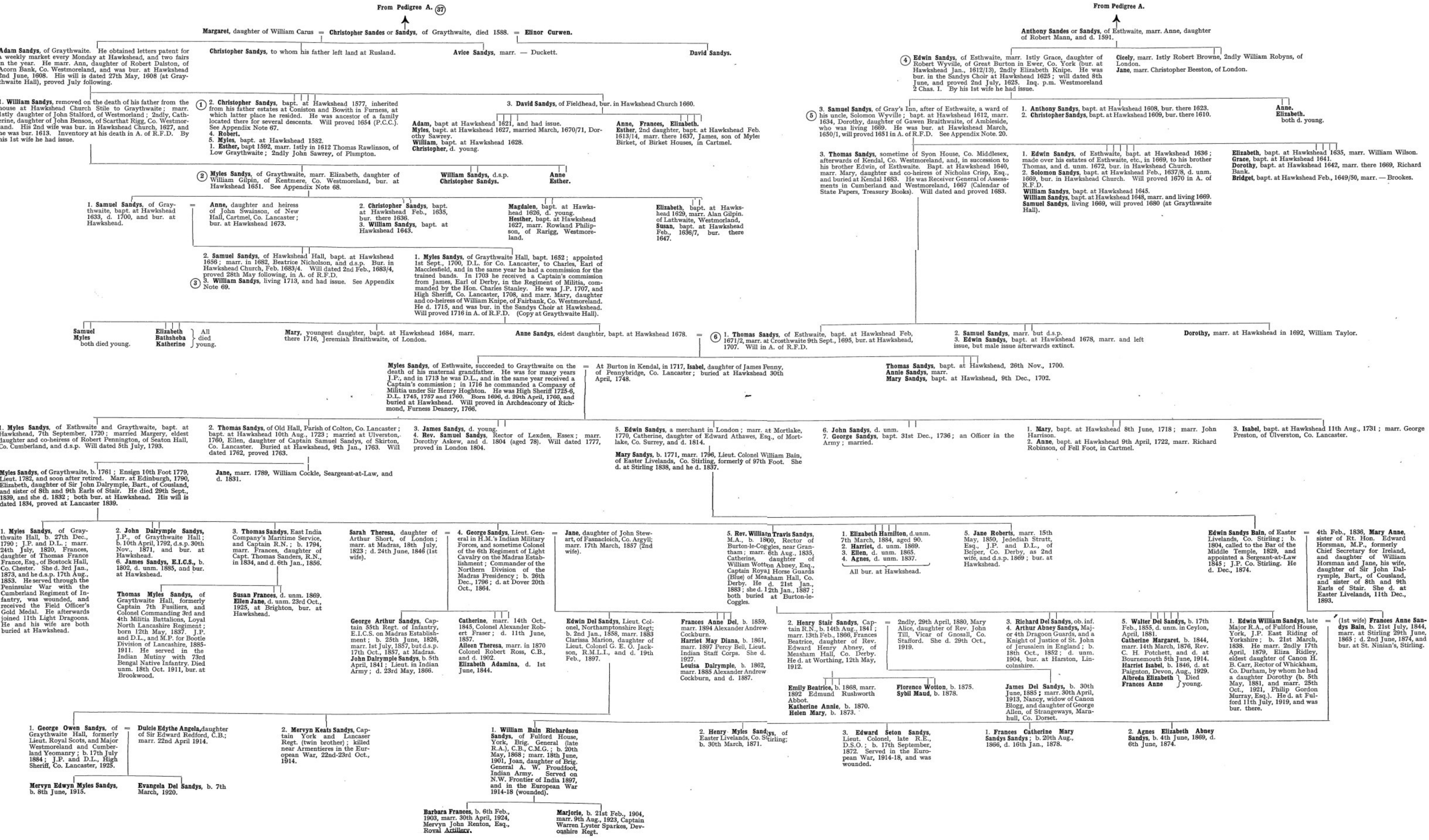

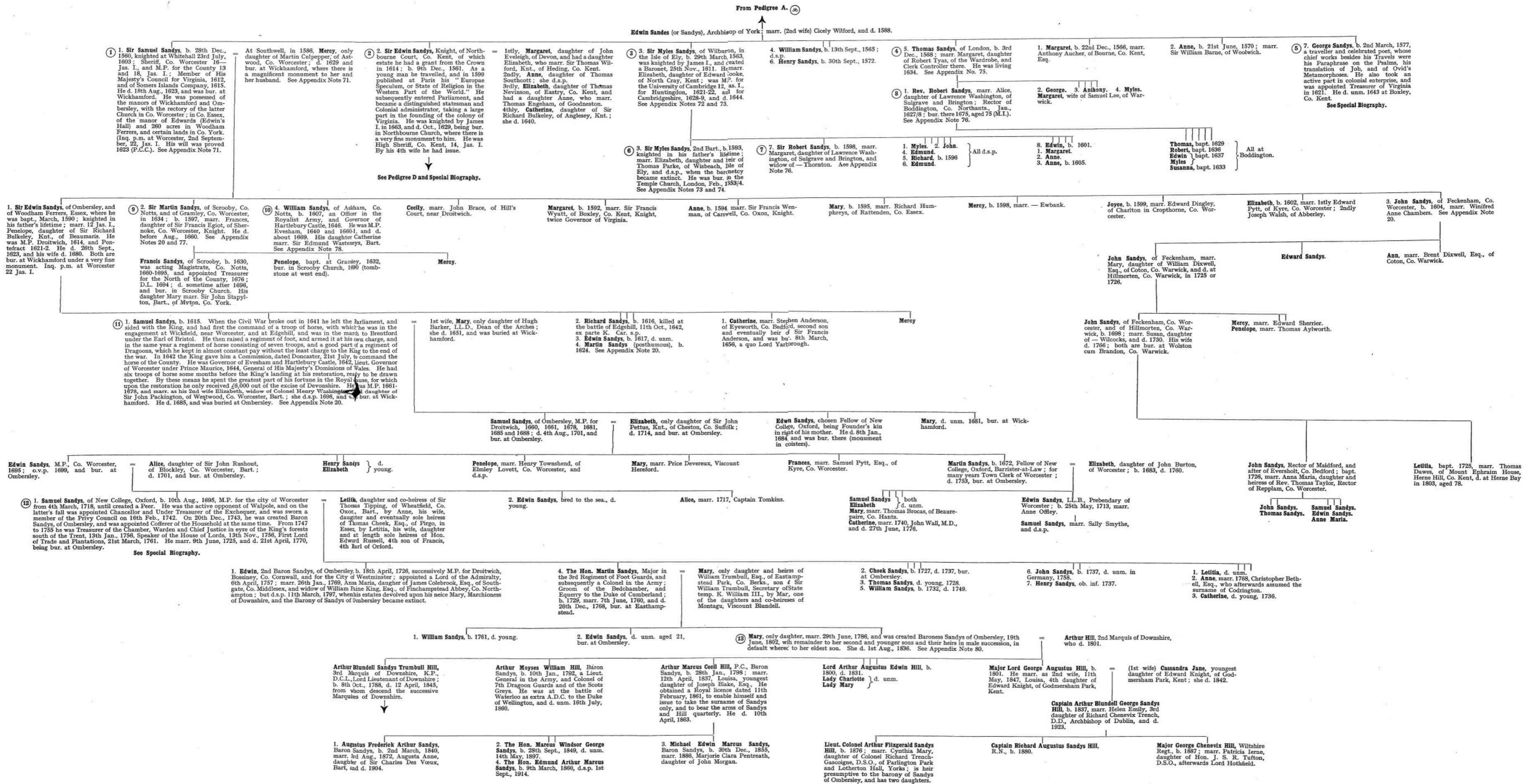

Sir Edwin Sandys, Knight, of Northbourne Court, Kent, marr. Katherine, daughter of Sir Richard Bulkeley, Knight, and d. 1629.

1. Henry Sandys, of Northbourne, aged 13 in 1619, marr. Margaret, daughter of Sir William Hammond, of St. Albans Court, Knt., and d.s.p. Will dated 21st Feb., 1636, proved 28th July, 1640. See Appendix Note 84.

2. Edwin Sandys, of Northbourne Court, a Colonel in the Parliament Army, was mortally wounded at the Battle of Powick, near Worcester, and d. 1642. He was bur. in Worcester Cathedral with his wife Catherine, daughter and eventually heiress of Richard Champneys, Esq., of Hall Place, Kent; she d. of smallpox while attending her wounded husband. See Section I (Civil War) and Appendix Note 17.

3. Richard Sandys, of Downe Court, near Westerham, Kent, which estate he purchased. He was a Colonel in the Parliament Army, and in 1647 was Deputy Governor of the Bermudas Company. He marr. Hester, daughter of Edwin Acher, of Hillsborough, Co. Kent, 2nd son of Anthony Acher, of Bourne, Co. Kent. D. 1669, and bur. with his wife in Downe Church. See Appendix Note 18.

Elizabeth, daughter of Sir Roger Jones, of Durhams-towne, Co. Meath, 1st Baron Jones of Navan and Viscount Ranelagh. His will is dated 1684 (Prerogative Wills of Ireland). His wife d. 1704, aged 75 (M.I. Roscommon Church), having survived all her children. See Appendix Notes 82 and 83.

1. Sir Richard Sandys, of Northbourne Court, Knt., marr. Mary, daughter of Sir Henry Heyman, of Somerfield, Bart. He commanded the troop and foot company of the county, and was "very active in the service" (Calendar of State Papers, Domestic, Chas. II.). He was accidentally killed, 8th Dec., 1669, by the explosion of his fowling-piece. Will dated 29th June, 1666 (York Registry).

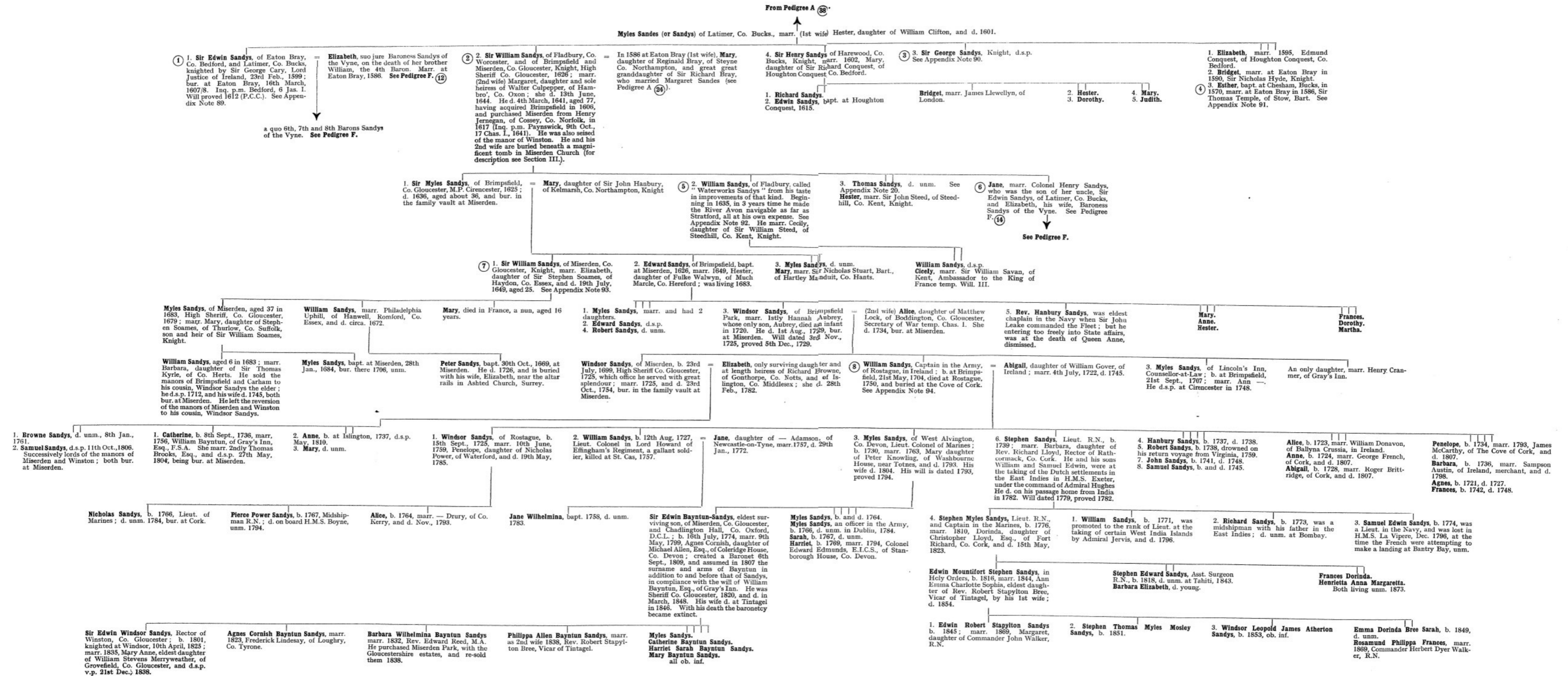

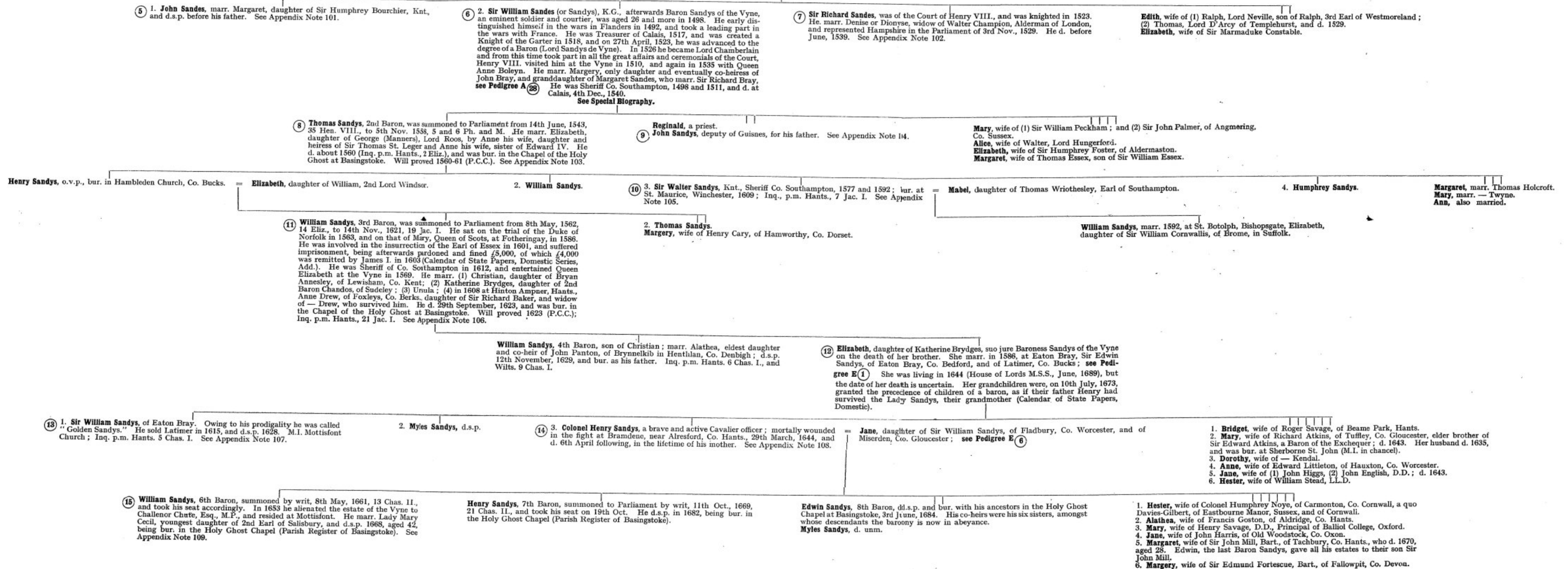

Sandys of the Vyne, Co. Hants.

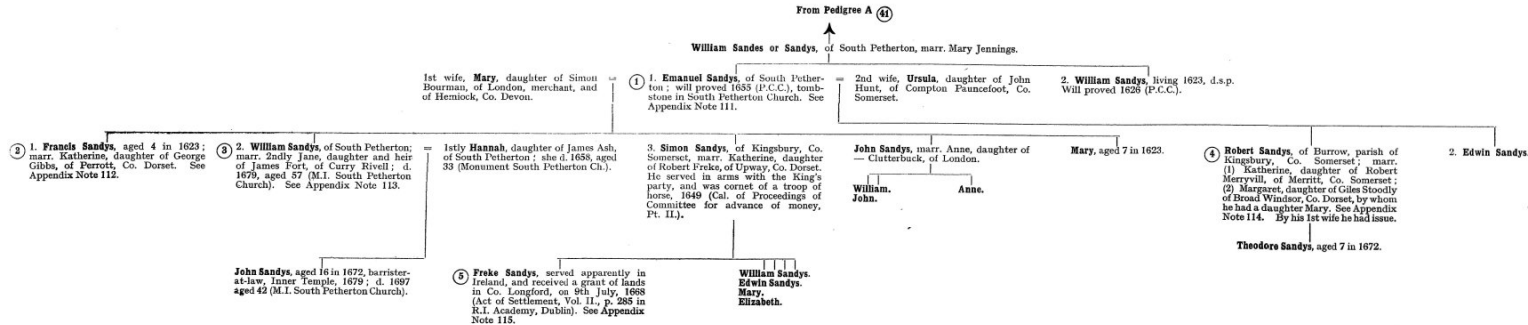

- 1 Sir John de Sandes, of Cholderton, near Andover, and of the Vyne, Co. Southampton, was one of Edward III.'s knights, and served in Gascony. He was Governor of Winchester Castle, 1382, Knight of the Shire, Co. Southampton, 1382, 1384 and 1393 (Calendar of Close Rolls, Richard II.), Sheriff 1383 and 1395. He marr. Joanna, heiress of the Fyfydes, of Fyfield, near Andover, and of Sherborne Coudray or the Vyne, Co. Hants.; and became possessed of the Vyne when his wife's inheritance fell in in 1386, she being the daughter of Agnes, who was sister of William, the father of Sir William Fyfyde, Knight, who d.s.p. 1386 (Calendarium Rotulorum Patentium in Turri Londinensi 13 Ric. II.). He d. before 1397 (Calendar of Close Rolls, 1st Feb., 1397), and his widow afterwards marr. Sir Thomas Skelton and d. 1415 (Inq. p.m. Hants. No. 31, 3 Hen. V.). See Appendix Note 96.
- 2 Sir Walter Sandes, of Cholderton and of the Vyne, Sheriff Co. Southampton, 1411 and 1424, marr. as 1st wife, Agnes, daughter of Thomas Warner. Speaking of the Vyne, Leland says that Sir Walter "gave it out" on the marriage of his daughter Joanna to William Brocas in 1420. He marr. 2ndly Margaret, only daughter and heir of John de Erlegh, who afterwards marr. Sir William Cheyne and d. 17th June, 1435. (See Inq. p.m. No. 33, 13 Hen. VI., and No. 37, 21 Hen. VI., and Appendix Note 97). By his 1st wife he had issue.
- 3 Thomas Sandes, of Cholderton, son and heir, prob. act. 4-5 Hen. VI. (Inq. p.m. No. 48, 26th Nov., 1425; see also Inq. p.m. No. 41 of same year, held on the death of his grandfather, Thomas Warner); marr. Sibella, who d. circa 1445-6 (Inq. p.m. Hants., No. 40, 24 Hen. VI.). He d. about 1441 (Inq. p.m. No. 35 20 Hen., VI.). See Appendix Note 98.
- 4 Sir William Sandes, of Cholderton and of the Vyne, son and heir, prob. act. 38-39 Hen. VI. (Inq. p.m. Hants. No. 75). He marr. Margaret, daughter of Sir John Cheney, of Skurland, in Sheppey, and recovered the Vyne on the death s.p. of Bernard Brocas, son of his aunt Joanna, on 20th May, 1488 (Inq. p.m. 3rd Nov., 4 Hen. VII.). He died 26th Oct., 1497, and his will, proved 8th April, 1498, is given in "Testamenta Vetusta," page 422. See Inq. p.m. Hants., 8th Feb., 1498, and Sussex, 2nd March, 1498, and Appendix Notes 99 and 100.

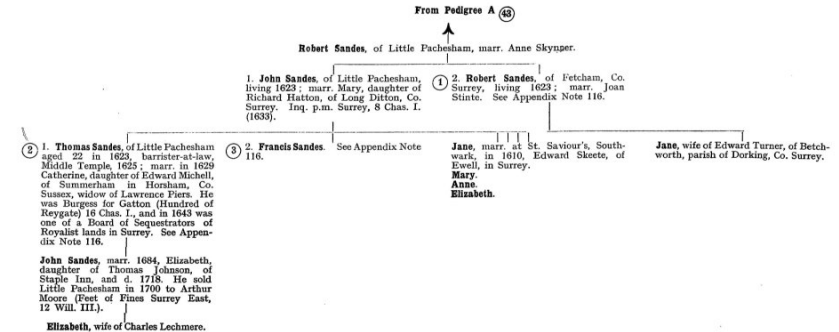

1 William Sandes, baptised at St. Beas, 1697, was one of the "Forty-nine Officers," being named in the Inrolments of the Adjudications in favour of (A.D. 1649) Officers (formerly denominated "the 49 Lots"), being one of the Arrear of Commissioned Officers on the waiting list for a Grant of Lands from the Crown in recognition of having served in the Wars of Ireland previous to 5th June, 1649, in the reign of Charles I. He also applied for lands by virtue of serving in Ireland during the Commonwealth period; and, having received large grants of land in Co. Kerry, consisting of a great portion of the confiscated estates of the House of O'Connor, whose seat was Carrigafoyle Castle, he settled there, and was ancestor of the Sandes of Carrigafoyle. He marr. Elizabeth Fernley, who d. 1658 (funeral entry). See Appendix Note 117.

2 Lancelot Sandes, of Carrigafoyle, Co. Kerry, also claimed lands by virtue of serving in Ireland during the Commonwealth period, and received certain grants.
