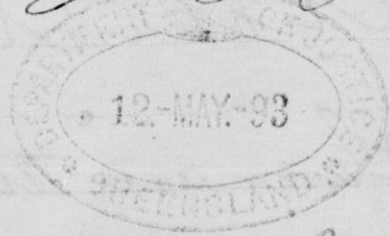

CERTIFICATE OF PARTICULARS.—INQUEST OF DEATH.

day of *April* ~~May~~ 189*3*, I held an Inquest of Death
at *Wogaroo Asylum* in the Police District of
Woolley and that the following particulars

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James Robert Nicoll on oath saith:-
I am a registered medical practitioner in Queensland
and Assistant Superintendent of the
Hospital for the Insane at Goodna I knew de-
ceased patient Frederick Charles Saunders
He was admitted to this Hospital on September 20
1884 an idiot and epileptic. He had fair
bodily health during his stay here but there
was no growth or development either of mind
or of body. He had frequent epileptic attacks
He was seen to be ill on 23rd April & was put
to bed He sank rapidly and died at 5.10 am
April 24 I made an examination of the body
on that day and found complete atrophy of
the left side of the brain The cause of death

was Epilepsy

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Richard McKern on oath says:-
I am an attendant at this Asylum
I knew the deceased patient
Frederick Charles Saunders, he was
an 'Epileptic' patient, on the night
of the 23 April I noticed that
he did not seem as well as
usual and I drew the Doctors
attention to him, he appeared
to gradually sink and died
in my presence at 5.15 AM
24 April 1893. He was
seen the evening before his death
by Dr Nicoll. Richard McKern
